UPDATE – 2/2/12

The victim from this morning's homicide in the 1000 block of Central Road has been identified as DEMOND SANFORD, 36, 2292 70TH. Sanford was found shot inside a vehicle that ended up in the 9700 block of Chinn. He was pronounced dead at the scene.

Two other men were also hit by gunfire in a separate vehicle and taken to local hospitals. One victim, a 33 year old man, suffered critical wounds. The other, 32 years old, was in good condition at last report.

ORIGINAL – 2/2/12

At approximately 00:41 hours, 2-2-12 Uniform Patrol Officers (4th District) were dispatched to the 1000 block of Central Road relative to gunshots being fired in the area. Upon arrival in the area officers located an unoccupied vehicle just north (9700 Chinn) of Central Road that had been hit by the gunfire, and Officers also located another vehicle behind a house at 1060 Central Road that had also been hit by the gunfire. Officers checked the vehicle behind the house and discovered the body of a male who was deceased inside the vehicle. HQ advised officers that they had also received a call from 999 Rosenwald advising that two b/m's were at the location who had been shot, and the males advised that they were shot on Central Road and ran to Rosenwald Offices arrived at the location and contacted the two males who were treated by EMS on scene and transported to a local hospital one with life threaten injuries, and the other non life threaten at the time. The Violent Crimes Division was notified and responded to the scene, and the case was turned over to Violent Crimes Detectives. At this time there is no known motive for the shooting.
